

# **Privacy Policy** (March 2021)

Together in Barnet (TiB) is a registered charity (1157192) whose aim is to tackle homelessness in the London Borough of Barnet. It runs a night shelter within the local community to house rough sleepers drawing on volunteers who provide dinner, bed and breakfast for those in need. As part of our work, we collect and process personal data about the people who interact with us. We only collect the bare minimum we need to offer our services and do our work. This notice outlines what data we collect, how we may use it, how we protect your data and your rights, and how you can exercise those rights. # The information we collect

We may collect, use, store and transfer personal data about you as follows:

## Who do we share your information with?

In very specific circumstances we may share your personal data with the following organisations or third parties:

**Our partner organisation** - Homeless Action in Barnet; we only share information with our partner organisation that is strictly necessary to meet our charitable purposes. We do not share any data for the purpose of marketing of promoting our services.

Third parties that process personal data on our behalf – third party service providers (such as our data storage providers, data analytics providers and IT technical support) who process personal data as part of providing a service to us, may also have access to your personal data. They will be required to keep your personal data secure and will not be allowed to use your personal data for their own purposes unless they have a specific legal requirement to do so.

Law enforcement, government agencies, courts and other official bodies - where we believe disclosure is necessary (i) as a matter of applicable law or regulation, (ii) to exercise, establish or defend our legal rights, or (iii) to protect your vital interests or those of any other person.

#### How long do we keep this information?

**For guests at our shelters** - we will store your personal information for the length of time you stay with us and then, for a period of up to a maximum of one year after your stay.

**For volunteers** - we will store your personal information for the length of time that you are a volunteer with us. We will continue to store your information for up to a maximum of one year from the point you finish volunteering with us. If you provide us with initial details but do not end up volunteering with us, we will securely delete your information within three months.

For donations made to us - we will store your personal information for the time you are making regular donations to Together in Barnet. Should you decide to stop donating to us, we will store your information for up to a maximum of one year from the point you end your donations. If you provide us with initial details but do not end up donating to us, we will securely delete your information within three months.

Where you have given consent for us to keep you informed about Together in Barnet- if at any time you decide that you no longer wish to receive marketing communications from us, you have the right to opt out by contacting us at admin@togetherinbarnet.org. If you opt out of receiving marketing from us, we will securely delete the information that we hold about you for this purpose within two working days.

## **Cookies Policy**

We use cookies (small files or pieces of text that download to a device when someone accesses a website or app) to enhance the online experience of visitors to the website, to better understand how the site is used, to ensure that it is secure and to prevent fraud. We will ask you to give your consent to the use of cookies when you arrive on our website.

Together in Barnet keeps your information securely in accordance with our Data Protection and Information Security Policy. Once we no longer need to store your information as described above, we will securely delete it in line with our policy.

# Your rights and what you can do if you are concerned

Under data protection law, you have rights we need to make you aware of. The rights available to you depend on our reason for processing your information.

#### You are able to:

- Ask us for copies of the personal information we hold about you.
- Request correction of your personal information that is inaccurate.
- Request erasure of your personal information in certain circumstances.
- Object to processing of personal information in certain circumstances.
- Request restriction of processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.
- Ask that we transfer the information you gave us from one organisation to another, or give it to
  you. The right only applies if we are processing information based on your consent or under, or
  in talks about entering into a contract and the processing is automated.

These rights are subject to various legal exceptions. In the event you make a request to us, we will write to you explaining if we have relied upon any of these exceptions in responding to your request.
